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Getting Started

the weather cap

This product contains a lithium-ion battery. To prevent serious bodily injury or damage to the unit or vehicle, remove the unit from the vehicle when exiting or store it out of direct sunlight.

NOTICE

Before mounting the device, see the *Important Safety and Product Information* guide for information about laws pertaining to windshield mounting.

Installing the zūmo Battery

- 1. Locate the lithium-ion battery that came in the product box.
- Slide the release key up to open the battery cover on the back of the zūmo.

- 3. Locate the metal contacts on the end of the lithium-ion battery.
- 4. Insert the battery so that the metal contacts on the battery match up with the metal contacts inside the battery compartment.



- 5. Press the battery into place.
- 6. Slide the battery cover back on until it clicks into place.

Charging Your zūmo

Charge your $z\bar{u}mo$ for at least 4 hours before using on battery power.

- Use the automotive power cable.
- Use the USB cable.
- Use an optional AC adapter cable.
- Use an optional battery charger.

Mounting Your zūmo in an Automobile

 Pull back the weather cap from the mini-USB connector located on the back of your zūmo.



- 2. Plug the vehicle power cable into the mini-USB connector.
- 3. Snap the cradle onto the suction cup arm.



- Remove the clear plastic from the suction cup. Clean and dry your windshield and the suction cup with a lint-free cloth.
- 5. Place the suction cup on the windshield.
- 6. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
- 7. Fit the bottom of your zūmo into the cradle.



- 8. Tilt the zūmo back until it snaps into place.
- Plug the other end of the vehicle power cable into a power outlet in your vehicle. Your zūmo should turn on automatically if it is plugged in and the vehicle is running.

Mounting Your zūmo on the Motorcycle

Incorrectly wiring the power cable with bare wire leads can result in damage to the vehicle or the battery and can cause bodily injury. Garmin strongly recommends having an experienced installer with the proper knowledge of electrical systems install the unit.

NOTICE

To avoid draining the motorcycle battery, disconnect the power cable from your zūmo device when you are not riding.

NOTE: Select a suitable and secure location to mount the zūmo on your motorcycle, based on available power sources and safe cable routing.

Installing the Handlebar Base

The zūmo includes parts for two handlebar installation solutions. Custom mounts can require additional hardware (www.ram-mount.com).

Installing the U-bolt and handlebar base:

- Place the U-bolt around the handlebar, and thread the ends through the handlebar base.
- 2. Tighten the nuts to secure the base. Do not overtighten.

NOTE: The recommended torque is 50 lbf-in. Do not exceed torque of 80 lbf-in.



Installing the handlebar base to the clutch/brake clamp bracket:

NOTE: Both 1/4 in. standard and M6 bolts are included. Match the size of the factory bolts on your clutch/brake clamp bracket.

- 1. Remove the two factory bolts on your clutch/brake clamp bracket.
- 2. Thread the new bolts through the handlebar base, spacers, and clamp bracket.
- 3. Tighten the bolts to secure the base.





Attaching the Base Plate to the zūmo Mount

- 1. Thread the M4 × 40 mm panhead screws through the washers, the cradle, the spacers, and base plate.
- 2. Tighten the nuts to secure the base plate.

Attaching the Base Plate to the Handlebar Base

- Align the ball of the handlebar base and the ball of the base plate with the double-socket arm.
- 2. Tighten the knob slightly.
- 3. Adjust for better viewing and operation.
- 4. Tighten the knob to secure the mount.



Installing Your zūmo in the Mount

- 1. Fit the bottom of your zūmo into the cradle.
- 2. Tilt the zūmo back until it snaps into place.



Configuring the zūmo

To turn on your $z\overline{u}mo$, press and hold b. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Acquiring Satellites

Go outdoors to an open area, out of garages, and away from tall buildings. Stop your vehicle, and turn on the zūmo. Acquiring satellite signals may take a few minutes.

The **DOD** bars indicate satellite strength. When the bars are green, the zūmo has acquired satellite signals. Now you can select a destination and navigate to it.

Removing Your zūmo from Either Mount

- 1. Press the release lever on the top of the mount to release the zūmo.
- 2. Lift out the zūmo.

Pairing your Bluetooth[®] Headset

You can listen to zūmo audio with your Bluetooth headset. The first time you use two devices together, you must "pair" them. Your Bluetooth headset and the zūmo must be turned on and be within 10 meters of each other. After the initial pairing, the two devices can connect automatically each time you turn them on.

- 1. Touch Tools > Settings > Bluetooth.
- Enable Bluetooth technology on your zūmo.
- 3. Under connections, touch **Add** or **Change**.
- 4. Enable Find Me/Discoverable/Visible mode on your headset.
- 5. Touch **OK** on the zūmo.
- 6. Select your headset, and touch OK.
- Enter the Bluetooth PIN for your headset, if necessary, and touch Done.

8. Touch OK.

Using the Menu Page



- GPS satellite strength.
- **2** Bluetooth headset status.
- Usage mode. Touch to change to to motorcyling, driving, walking, bicycling, or scootering mode.

4 Battery status.

- **6** Touch to find a destination.

- Touch to view the map.
- **8** Touch to adjust the volume.

NOTE: If you have a Bluetooth headset paired with your zūmo, adjust the volume from your headset.

 Touch to use the tools such as settings, Where Am I?, Help, and routes.

zūmo Tips and Shortcuts

- To quickly return to the Menu page, touch and hold **Back**.
- Touch and and to see more choices. Touch and hold these buttons to scroll faster.
- Pages appear differently based on your usage mode and settings.

Selecting a Usage Mode







Your zūmo offers several usage modes for different modes of transportation. Routing and navigation are calculated differently based on your usage mode. For example, one-way streets are treated differently in walking mode than they are in driving mode.

Changing Your Usage Mode

- 1. Touch the usage mode icon.
- 2. Select a mode, and touch **OK**.
- Touch Yes, and follow the on-screen instructions to configure your usage mode settings. For more information about custom settings, see page 31.

Using the Power Button

Press and quickly release the ⁽⁾ Power button to view additional options:

- Touch 🔮 and 🕤 to adjust the screen brightness.
- Touch 🔊 and <a>To adjust screen brightness.
- Touch the box next to **Mute** to turn off the audio.

Resetting Your zūmo

If your zūmo stops functioning, reset your zūmo by pressing and holding the **O** Power button.

Finding Points of Interest

- 1. Touch Where To? > Points of Interest.
- 2. Select a category.
- 3. Select a destination, and touch Go!.

To search by name, touch Where To? > Points of Interest > Spell Name.

To search in a different area, touch **Where To?** > **Near**.

Using the Go! Page



- **1** Touch to view the route on the map.
- **2** Touch to start navigating the route.
- 3 Touch to view this location and surrounding areas on the map. See page 18.
- Touch to save this location to your Favorites.

Adding a Stop to Your Route

- 1. With a route active, touch **Menu** > **Where To?**.
- 2. Search for the extra stop (Via Point).
- 3. Touch Go!.

 Touch Add as Via Point to add this stop before your destination. OR

Touch **Set as new Destination** to make this your new final destination.

Taking a Detour

If the road ahead is closed, you can take a detour.

NOTE: Detour is not available when navigating off road.

- 1. With a route active, touch **Menu**.
- 2. Touch Detour.

The zūmo attempts to find an alternate route that avoids the current road or the next road on your turn list, and then returns to your original route. If the route you are currently navigating is the only reasonable option, the zūmo might not calculate a detour.

Where To?

The Where To? menu provides several different categories you can use to search for locations. To learn how to perform a simple search, see page 10.

TIP: Touch **Near** to change the search area. See page 17.

Finding an Address

- 1. Touch Where To? > Address.
- 2. Change the state, the country, or the province, if necessary.
- 3. Touch **Spell City**, enter the city/postal code, and touch **Done**. Select the city/ postal code in the list. (Not all map data provides postal code searching.) If you are unsure of the city, touch **Search All**.
- 4. Enter the number of the address, and touch **Done**.
- 5. Enter the street name, and touch **Done**.

- 6. Select the correct street in the list, if necessary.
- 7. Touch the address, if necessary.

NOTE: Depending on the version of the maps loaded on your zūmo, the button names can change and some steps could be ordered differently.

Setting a Home Location

You can set a home location for the place you return to most often.

- 1. Touch Where To? > Go Home.
- 2. Select an option.
- 3. Enter your addres, and touch Go!

Going Home

After you set your home location, you can route to it at any time by touching **Where To?** > **Go Home**.

Changing Your Home Location

To change your home location, you must first delete it from Favorites.

- 1. Touch Where To? > Favorites.
- 2. Select your home.
- 3. Touch Home > Edit > Delete > Yes.

After you delete your home location, reset it by following the steps on page 12.

Finding a Place by Spelling the Name

If you know the name of the location you are looking for, you can spell it using the on-screen keyboard. You can also enter letters contained in the name to narrow the search.

- 1. Touch Where To? > Points of Interest > Spell Name.
- 2. Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters in the name. Touch **Done**.

Using the On-Screen Keyboard

When an on-screen keyboard appears, touch a letter or number to enter it.



- Touch 🛅 to view a list of recently found search words.
- Touch local to delete a character. Touch and hold local to erase the entire entry.
- Touch 🖵 to add a space.
- Touch to switch between uppercase and lowercase characters.
- Touch **Lang.** to select the keyboard language mode.
- Touch **123** to enter special characters, such as punctuation marks.

Where To?

Finding Recently Found Places

Your zūmo stores the last 50 of your recent finds in the Recently Found list. Touch **Where To?** > **Recently Found**. The most-recently viewed places appear at the top of the list.

Deleting Recently Found Places

To remove all places from the Recently Found list, touch **Clear** > **Yes**.

NOTE: When you touch **Clear**, all items from the list are removed. This process does not delete the actual place from your zūmo.

Favorites

You can save places in your Favorites so that you can quickly find them and create routes to them. Your home location is also stored in Favorites.

Saving Your Current Location

On the map, touch **Save Location** to save your current location.

Saving Places You Find

- 1. After you have found a place you want to save, touch **Save**.
- 2. Touch **OK**. The place is saved in Favorites.

Finding Saved Places

Touch **Where To?** > **Favorites**. Your saved locations are listed.

Editing Saved Places

- 1. Touch Where To? > Favorites.
- 2. Touch the location you want to edit.
- 3. Touch Edit.



4. Select an item to edit.

For information about extras such as safety camera information, see pages 43.

Using Custom Routes

Touch Where To? > Custom Routes.

Select the route you want to take, and touch **Go!**.

Creating a Custom Route

Use your zūmo to create and save custom routes before your next trip. You can save up to 10 custom routes.

- 1. Touch Where To? (or Tools) > Custom Routes > New.
- 2. Touch Add New Start Point.
- 3. Find a location as your starting point, and touch **Select**.
- 4. Touch Add New End Point.
- 5. Find a location as your ending point, and touch **Select**.



- Touch
 to add another location to your custom route. Touch
 to remove a location.
- 7. Touch **Next** to calculate your custom route and view it on the map.
- 8. Touch **Save** to save the custom route and exit.

Editing Custom Routes

- 1. Touch Where To? (or Tools) > Custom Routes.
- 2. Select the route you want to edit.
- 3. Touch Edit.
- 4. Select an item to edit.

Entering Coordinates

If you know the geographic coordinates of your destination, you can use your zūmo to navigate to your destination using the latitude and longitude coordinates (or other coordinate formats). This can be especially helpful when geocaching. For information about geocaching, go to www.geocaching.com.

- 1. Touch Where To? > Coordinates.
- Touch Format to change the type of coordinates. Because different maps and charts use different position formats, the zūmo allows you to select the correct coordinate format for the type of map you are using.
- 3. Enter the coordinates, and touch **Done**.

Finding a Place Using the Map

Touch Where To? > Browse Map.

Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map, and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Touch and + to zoom out and in.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object.
- Touch Save to save this location.
- Touch **Go!** to navigate to the location. If the GPS mode is off, touch **Set Loc.** to set your location to the selected location. See page 31.

Using TracBack®

Touch Where To? > TracBack to view your recent track. Touch Save to save the track to your Favorites. Touch Go! to retrace your recent path of travel.

Searching Near Another Location

NOTE: Your zūmo automatically searches for places near your current location.

- 1. Touch Where To? > Near.
- 2. Select an option.

Using the Main Pages

Your route is marked with a magenta line. As you travel, your zūmo guides you to your destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the map. A checkered flag marks your destination. If you deviate from the original route, your zūmo recalculates the route and provides new directions.



• Touch to view the next turn (navigating on road).



2 Touch the text bar to view the turn list.



- 3 Touch to zoom in and out.
- 4 Touch the vehicle icon to view the Where Am I? page.
- 5 Touch to view the trip computer.





• Touch to view the Menu page.

Trip Computer

The trip computer displays your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip.

To view the trip computer, touch **Speed** on the map. If you make frequent stops, leave the zūmo turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

Resetting Trip Computer

If you want accurate trip information, reset the trip computer before beginning a trip. Touch **Reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Computer page. Touch **Reset Max** to reset the maximum speed.

Turn List

When you are navigating a route, the turn list displays turn-by-turn instructions for your entire route and the distance between turns. Touch the text bar on the top of the map to open the turn list. Touch a turn on the list to view the next turn information. Touch **Show Map** to view the entire route on the map.

Next Turn

When you are navigating a route, you can view the next turn on the map and the distance and time left before you reach the turn.

To view the next turn, touch the top left corner on the map, or touch any turn from the turn list.

Routes Page

The Routes page displays three different types of routes to your destination: fastest time, shortest distance, and off road. Touch a route button on the side of the screen to select that route. See page 31 for more information on route preferences.

Using the Main Pages

On the Go! page, touch the route information tab, which lists your usage mode and the distance and time to your destination, to open the Routes page.

Compass



You can navigate using a GPS compass. No calibration is required; however, you must have a clear view of the sky. Touch a data field on the Map page to view the compass. When you are traveling, the compass rotates. The bug indicator shows your current heading. Your heading is also shown in degrees in the center of the compass. The information fields display the speed, the elevation, the time of day, and the GPS signal accuracy.

Navigating Off Road with the Compass

When navigating an off-road route, the direction arrow indicates the direction you should travel to stay on the route. When the direction arrow points at the bug indicator, you are going directly to the destination. The lower-left information field displays the distance to your destination.

Managing Files

You can store files, such as JPEG image files and GPX route files, in the internal memory on the zūmo or on a microSD card.

NOTE: The zūmo is not compatible with Windows[®] 95, 98, Me, or Windows NT[®]. It is also not compatible with Mac[®] OS 10.3 and earlier.

Supported File Types

- JPEG, JPG, PNG, BMP, and GIF image files: see page 23
- Maps, routes, and waypoints files from MapSource[®]: see page 43
- GPI custom POI files from the Garmin POI Loader: see page 44

Loading Files



Inserting a microSD Card (Optional)

- Slide the release key up to open the battery cover on the back of the zūmo.
- 2. Remove the battery.
- 3. To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks.
- 4. Replace the battery.

Managing Files

5. Slide the battery cover back on until it clicks into place.

Connecting the USB Cable

Connect the mini-USB connector to the back of the zūmo. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.

Your zūmo and microSD card appear as removable drives in My Computer on Windows computers and as mounted volumes on Mac computers.

NOTE: Some operating systems or computers with multiple network drives cannot display the zūmo drives. See your operating system Help file to learn how to map the drives.

Transferring Files to Your zūmo

Copy and paste files from your computer into the zūmo drives/volumes.

- 1. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
- Select the file, and touch Edit > Copy.
- 3. Open the "Garmin" or microSD card drive/volume.
- Click Edit > Paste. The file appears in the list of files in the zūmo memory or on the microSD card.

Ejecting and Unplugging the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, click the eject si icon in your system tray, or drag the volume icon to the **Trash** on Mac computers. Unplug your zūmo from your computer.

Loading Photos for Photo Navigation

Download photos with location information to your zūmo or microSD card for photo navigation. Visit http://connect.garmin.com/photos for more information.

- 1. Connect your zūmo to your computer.
- 2. Go to http://connect.garmin.com /photos, and sign in.
- 3. Select a photo.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Deleting Files

NOTICE

If you do not know the purpose of a file, do not delete it. Your zūmo memory contains important system files that should not be deleted.

Connect the zūmo to your computer, and open the zūmo or microSD card drive/ volume. Highlight the file you want to delete, and press the **Delete** key on the computer keyboard.

Using the Tools

The Tools menu provides many features that are helpful when you are traveling. From the Menu page, touch **Tools** to access the Tools menu.



Settings

For information about the settings, see pages 31–37.

Where Am I?

Touch **Where Am I?** to view current location information. This feature is helpful if you need to tell emergency personnel your location. Touch a button on the right to view the nearest locations in that category. Touch **Save Location** to save your current location.

Help

Touch **Help** to get information about using your zūmo.

Picture Viewer

Use the picture viewer to view pictures that you have stored in your zūmo or on a microSD card.

- 1. Touch Tools > Picture Viewer.
- 2. Touch a picture to view a larger image of it.
- 3. Touch the arrows to view all the images.

Viewing a Slide Show

Touch **Slide Show** to start a slide show, which displays each image for a few seconds and then displays the next image. Touch anywhere on the screen to stop the slide show.

Navigating to a Picture

If a picture contains location information, touch **Info** > **Go!** to create a route to it. See page 23 for more information about loading pictures to your $z\bar{u}mo$.

Custom Routes

For information about custom routes, see page 15.

My Data

Use this tool to manage and delete your saved data, such as your Favorites. If you have transferred a route from MapSource, touch **Import Route from File** to use that route in your zūmo.

- 1. Touch Tools > World Clock.
- 2. To change a listed city, touch the city.
- 3. Enter a city name, and touch **Done**.
- 4. Select the correct city, if necessary.
- 5. Touch Save.
- Touch World Map to view a map. Nighttime hours are shown in the shaded area.
- Touch World Clock to view the clocks again, or touch Back to exit.

Calculator

1. Touch Tools > Calculator.



- 2. Enter the first number of your calculation.
- 3. Select an operator (\div , ×, -, or +).
- 4. Enter the second number of your calculation.
 - Touch . to add a decimal.
 - Touch ± to make the number negative or positive.
 - Touch % to make the number a percent (0.01).
 - Touch C to clear the entry.
- 5. Touch =.
- 6. Touch **C** to make a new calculation.

Unit Converter

- 1. Touch Tools > Unit Converter.
- 2. Touch **Conversion**, select a type of measurement, and touch **OK**.
- 3. Touch a unit of measure that you want to change.
- 4. Select a unit of measure, and touch **OK**. Repeat if necessary.
- 5. Touch the blank rectangle to enter a value.
- 6. Enter a value, and touch **Done**. The unit is converted.
- 7. Touch **Clear** to perform another conversion.

Updating Conversion Rates

You can update the currency conversion rates manually so that you are always using the most-current rates.

- 1. Touch Tools > Unit Converter > Conversion.
- 2. Touch Currency, and touch OK.
- 3. Touch the currency buttons, and select the currencies you want to update.
- 4. Touch Update.
- 5. Touch the boxes next to the currencies to enter new rates.
- Touch Save to save the new rates, or touch Restore to use the original rates.

Traffic

You can only access the traffic information if your zūmo is connected to an optional FM traffic receiver. For more information, see pages 28–30 and www.garmin.com/traffic.

Using FM Traffic

NOTE: You must purchase the traffic receiver separately.

Use an FM TMC (Traffic Message Channel) traffic receiver to receive traffic information that is broadcast over the FM Radio Data System.

The traffic receiver is integrated in the vehicle power cable.



If the zūmo is connected to the traffic receiver and connected to vehicle power, and you are in a coverage area, the zūmo can receive traffic delay information. For more information, go to www.garmin .com/traffic.

NOTE: Garmin is not responsible for the accuracy of the traffic information. The traffic receiver receives signals from the traffic service provider and displays that information on your zūmo.

Traffic in Your Area

When you are receiving traffic information, a traffic icon appears in the upper-right corner of the map. The traffic icon changes color to indicate the severity of traffic conditions on your route or the road you are currently driving on.



Severity Color Code

The color of the traffic icon indicates the severity of the traffic delay.

Color	Description	Meaning
Green	Low severity	Traffic is flowing normally.
Yellow	Medium severity	Traffic is slightly congested.
Red	High severity	Traffic is heavily congested or stopped.
Gray	No data	Traffic data has not updated.

Traffic on Your Route

When calculating your route, the zūmo examines the current traffic and automatically optimizes the route for the shortest time. If a severe traffic delay occurs on your route while you are navigating, the zūmo automatically recalculates the route. You might still be routed through traffic if no better alternative routes exist.

If a non-severe traffic delay occurs on your route, the traffic icon displays a tab that shows how much time the delay has added to your route. This time is already included in your estimated arrival time.

To manually avoid traffic on your route:

- 1. On the map, touch the traffic icon.
- 2. Touch Traffic On Route.
- 3. Touch the arrows to view other traffic delays on your route, if necessary.
- 4. Touch **Avoid** to avoid the traffic delay.

Viewing the Traffic Map

The Traffic map shows color-coded traffic flow and delays on nearby roads.

1. On the map, touch the traffic icon.



2. Touch **Show Traffic Map** to view the traffic incidents on a map.

To return to the normal map from the Traffic map, touch the traffic icon, and touch **Show Normal Map**.

Viewing Traffic Delays

- 1. On the Map page, touch the traffic icon.
- Touch Traffic Search to view a list of traffic delays.
- To view details, touch an item in the list. If there is more than one delay, touch the arrows to view additional delays.

Traffic Subscriptions

For information about adding or renewing a traffic subscription, see page 36.

Customizing the zūmo

- 1. Touch Tools > Settings.
- 2. Touch the setting you want to change.
- 3. Touch the button beside the setting name to change it.

NOTE: Some menus and settings change based on your usage mode. Look for a usage mode icon next to the setting. Not all settings are available for all usage modes.

System Settings

Touch Tools > Settings > System.

Usage Mode—specify how you will be navigating to optimize routes: Motorcycling, Driving, Walking, Bicycling. See page 9.

GPS Simulator—turn on the simulator to turn off the GPS mode and simulate navigation and to save battery power.

Units—change units of measure to Kilometers or Miles.

Keyboard Layout—select a preference.

- Standard Mode—an alphabetical layout.
- Large Mode—a layout that allows you to select from a range of eight letters at a time.

About—display the zūmo software version, the unit ID, the audio version and the GPS software version. You need this information when you update the system software or purchase additional map data. See page 43.

Restore—restore the system settings.

Navigation Settings

Touch Tools > Settings > Navigation.

Route Preference—select a preference for calculating your route:

• Faster Time—to calculate routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance.

- Shorter Distance—to calculate routes that are shorter in distance but can take more time to drive.
- Off Road—to calculate point-to-point routes without roads.

Avoidances—select the road types or conditions you want to avoid on your routes.

Recalculation—select whether your zūmo recalculates when you deviate from your route.

- **Auto**—recalculate a route automatically.
- **Off**—turn off the recalculate function.
- **Prompted**—enable a prompt when you deviate from your route.

Restore—restore the original navigation settings.

Display Settings Touch Tools > Settings > Display.

Color Mode—select **Daytime** for a light background, **Nighttime** for a dark background, or **Auto** to automatically switch between the two.

Screenshot—turn on screenshot mode. Touch state a screenshot. The picture bitmap file is saved in the screenshots folder on the zūmo drive.

Brightness—adjust the backlight brightness level. Reducing the backlight brightness increases your battery life.

Restore—restore the original display settings.

Enabling Fuel Tracking

When connected to the motorcycle mount, your zūmo can alert you when your fuel tank is low.

Touch Tools > Settings > Fuel Gauge.

Fuel Tracking—touch **On**. A fuel gauge appears under the compass on the map.

Distance Per Tank—enter the total distance your motorcycle can travel on a tank of fuel.

Low Fuel Warning—select at which point you would like to be notified that your fuel tank is low.

Using the Fuel Alarm

When your fuel tank is low enough to trigger the Remaining Fuel Alarm, a red fuel-pump icon appears on the map. Touch the icon to view a list of nearby gas stations. Time Settings Touch Tools > Settings > Time.

Time Format—select a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

Current Time—Use + and - to set the time in 15-minute increments. Check **Automatic** to automatically set the time when your zūmo is receiving satellite signals.

Restore—restore the original time settings.

Language Settings Touch Tools > Settings > Language.

Voice—change the language for voice prompts.

Text—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the text language does not change the language of user-entered data or map data, such as street names.

Keyboard—select the keyboard for your language. You can also change the keyboard language mode from any keyboard by touching the **Mode** button.

Restore—restore the original language settings.

Map Settings

Touch Tools > Settings > Map.

Map Detail—adjust the amount of detail shown on the map. Showing more detail can cause the map to redraw slower.

Map View—select a map perspective.

- **Track Up**—display the map in two dimensions (2D) with your direction of travel at the top.
- North Up—display the map in 2D with North at the top.
- **3D View**—display the map in three dimensions (3D) with your direction of travel at the top.

Map Autozoom—Touch Off to turn autozoom off.

Vehicle—touch Change to change the icon used to display your position on the map. Touch the icon you want to use, and touch OK. Download additional vehicle icons at www.garmin.com /vehicles.

Trip Log—show or hide the log of your travels. To clear your trip log, touch **Tools** > **My Data** > **Clear Trip Log**.

Map Info—view the maps and the version of each map loaded on your zūmo. Select a map to enable that map.

Restore—restore the original map settings.

Vehicle Settings

Touch Tools > Settings > Vehicle Selection.

Touch the icon you want to use, and touch **OK**.

Download additional vehicle icons at www.garmin.com/vehicles.

Bluetooth Settings

Touch Tools > Settings > Bluetooth.

Connections—touch the button to pair with a headset that has Bluetooth wireless technology, or to see a list of available devices. Touch **Drop** to disconnect a headset. Touch **Remove** to delete a headset from the zūmo memory.

Bluetooth—turn on the Bluetooth component. To prevent a headset from automatically connecting, touch **Disabled**. **Restore**—restore the original Bluetooth settings. This does not clear the pairing information.

Position Format Settings Touch Tools > Settings > Position Format.

Format—select a position format.

Datum-select a map datum.

Security Settings

Touch Tools > Settings > Security.

Garmin Lock—turn on Garmin Lock™ to lock your zūmo. Enter a 4-digit PIN, and set a security location. For more information, see page 39.

Safe Mode—turn safe mode on or off. When your vehicle is moving, safe mode disables all functions that require significant operator attention and could become a distraction while driving. **Restore**—restore the original security settings.

NOTE: Restoring the security settings will not clear your Garmin Lock PIN or security location.

Traffic Subscription Information

The traffic information is only available if you have an optional FM traffic receiver. Touch **Tools** > **Settings** > **Traffic**.

NOTE: If your traffic receiver has a trial subscription, it does not need to be activated, and you do not need to purchase a subscription until the trial subscription expires.

North American Options

Your FM traffic subscriptions and expiration dates are listed. Touch **Add** to add a subscription.

European Options

Auto—select to use the best provider for the area. You can also select a specific provider.

Search—search for additional TMC traffic providers. To increase the search time, touch **Yes** to clear the provider table.

Subscriptions—view your FM traffic subscriptions and expiration dates. Touch **Add** to add a subscription.

Adding a Subscription

You can purchase additional subscriptions or a renewal if your subscription expires. Go to www.garmin .com/fmtraffic.

NOTE: You do not need to activate the subscription included with your FM traffic receiver (if it came with one). The subscription activates automatically after your zūmo acquires satellite signals

while receiving traffic signals from the service provider.

- From the Menu page, touch Tools > Settings > Traffic.
- For North American units, touch Add. For non-North American units, touch Subscriptions > Add.
- 3. Write down the traffic receiver unit ID.
- 4. Go to www.garmin.com/fmtraffic to purchase a subscription and get a 25-character code.
- 5. Touch **Next** on the zūmo, enter the code, and touch **Done**.

The traffic subscription code cannot be reused. You must obtain a new code each time you renew your service. If you own multiple traffic receivers, you must obtain a new code for each receiver.

Restoring All Settings

- 1. Touch Tools > Settings.
- 2. Touch Restore.
- 3. Touch Yes.

Appendix

Registering Your zūmo

Go to http://my.garmin.com to register your zūmo. See page 21 for information about connecting your zūmo to your computer.

- Plug in your zūmo. You will see an option to install myGarmin Agent[™] (optional).
- Follow the on-screen instructions to install myGarmin Agent and register your zūmo.

After you have registered your zūmo, you can subscribe to the latest Garmin online services.

Caring for Your zūmo

Your zūmo contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your zūmo, avoid dropping your unit and operating it in high-shock and high-vibration environments.

Cleaning the Unit

The zūmo is constructed of high-quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the outer casing of the unit (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution, and wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Touch Screen

Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth, and gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your zūmo

- Do not store the zūmo where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur, because it can cause permanent damage.
- Although a PDA stylus can be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle.
- Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen because damage might result.

Avoiding Theft

- To avoid theft, remove the unit and mount from sight when not in use. Remove the residue left on the windshield by the suction cup.
- Do not keep your unit in the glove compartment.
- Register your product at http://mygarmin.com.
- Use the Garmin Lock feature.

Locking Your zūmo

Garmin Lock is a theft-deterrent system that locks your zūmo. Each time you turn on the zūmo, enter the PIN or drive to the security location.

- 1. Touch Tools > Settings > Security.
- 2. Touch the button below **Garmin** Lock.
- 3. Enter a 4-digit PIN, and drive to a security location.

What is a Security Location?

Your security location should be a location you return to often, such as your home. If the zūmo has satellite signals and you are at the security location, you do not need to enter the PIN.

NOTE: If you forget your PIN and your security location, you must send your zūmo to Garmin to get it unlocked. You must also send a valid product registration or proof of purchase.

Calibrating the Screen

If the touch screen is not responding properly, calibrate the touch screen.

- 1. Turn off your zūmo.
- 2. Press your finger on the upper-left corner of the touch screen.
- 3. While holding your finger on the touch screen, turn on the zūmo. Continue to hold your finger on the touch screen for about 30 seconds until the calibration screen appears (white screen with "Touch dot").
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Resetting the zūmo

If the zūmo stops functioning, turn the zūmo off and then on. If this does not help, press and hold \bigcirc for 10 seconds. The zūmo should operate normally. You can also remove the battery and reinstall it.

Updating the Software

In order to connect the zūmo to your computer, you must have the optional mini-USB cable. For information about accessories, go to http://buy.garmin.com or www.garmin.com/extras, or contact your Garmin dealer.

- Connect the zūmo to your computer using the mini-USB cable. The AutoPlay menu opens.
- Double-click on ▲ to open the myGarmin Agent download page. If the AutoPlay menu does not open, or you are on a Mac computer, go to www.garmin.com/agent.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

After you have installed myGarmin Agent, you are prompted to open myDashboard when you connect your zūmo to your computer. myDashboard checks your zūmo for current software and provides additional information about your zūmo.

Clearing User Data

NOTICE

This deletes all user-entered information.

- 1. Turn off your zūmo.
- 2. Press your finger on the lower-right corner of the touch screen.
- While holding your finger on the touch screen, turn on the zūmo. Continue to hold your finger on the touch screen until the message appears.
- 4. Touch **Yes** to clear all user data.

All original settings are restored. Any items that you have saved are erased.

Battery Information

Your zūmo contains a user-replaceable, lithium-ion battery. To maximize the lifetime of the battery, do not leave your zūmo in direct sunlight, and avoid prolonged exposure to excessive heat. The battery icon in the corner of the Menu page indicates the status of the zūmo battery. To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and fully charge it.

Replacing the Battery in the zūmo

If you need to replace the battery in the zūmo, use a Garmin lithium-ion battery 010-11143-00. Purchase a replacement battery at http://buy.garmin.com. Contact your local waste disposal department for information about properly disposing of the battery.

Changing the Fuse

NOTICE

When replacing the fuse, do not lose any of the small pieces and make sure they are put back in the proper position. The vehicle power cable does not work unless it is assembled correctly.

If your unit will not charge in your vehicle, you might need to replace the fuse located at the tip of the vehicle adapter.

- Use a coin to push down the silver tip, and turn the coin counter-clockwise, one-quarter turn.
- 2. Remove the end piece, the silver tip, and the fuse.
- 3. Install a 1 A fast-blow fuse of the same size.
- 4. Ensure that the silver tip is located in the end piece. Using a coin, replace the end piece.



Mounting on Your Dashboard

NOTICE

The **permanent** mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed.

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your unit to the dashboard and comply with certain state regulations.

- 1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you are placing the disk.
- 2. Remove the backing from the adhesive on the bottom of the disk.
- 3. Place the disk on the dashboard.
- 4. Remove the clear plastic cover from the top of the disk.
- 5. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk. Flip the lever down (toward the disk).

Additional Maps

You can purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps in your zūmo internal memory or on an optional microSD card.

To determine the versions of the maps that are loaded on your zūmo, open the Menu page. Touch **Tools** > **Settings** > **Map** > **Map Info**. Check www.garmin.com/unlock/update.jsp to see if an update for your map software is available. To enable additional maps, you need your unit ID (see page 31) and serial number (located under the battery).

Refer to the MapSource Help file for more information.

Safety camera information is available in some locations. Check http://my.garmin .com for availability. For these locations, the zūmo includes the locations of hundreds of safety cameras. Your zūmo alerts you when you are approaching a safety camera and can warn you if you are driving too fast. The data is updated at least weekly, so you always have access to the most up-to-date information.

You can purchase a new region or extend an existing subscription at any time. Each region that you purchase has its own expiration date.

Custom Points of Interest

Use the POI Loader to load custom points of interest (POIs) onto your zūmo. POI databases are available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom databases contain alert information for points, such as safety cameras and school zones.

Go to www.garmin.com/extras, and click **POI Loader** to install the POI Loader onto your computer. For more information, refer to the POI Loader Help file. Press **F1** to open the Help file.

To view your custom POIs, touch Where To? > Extras > Custom POIs. To change the proximity alert settings, touch Tools > Settings > Proximity Points > Proximity Alerts.

To delete the custom POIs from your zūmo, connect your zūmo to your computer. Open the **Garmin\poi** folder in the zūmo drive or the microSD card drive. Delete the file titled **poi.gpi**.

nüMaps Guarantee[™]

To receive one free map update (if available), register your device at http://my.garmin.com within 60 days of acquiring satellites while driving with your device. You are not eligible for the free map update if you register by phone or wait longer than 60 days after the first time you acquire satellites while driving with your device. For more information, go to www.garmin.com/numaps.

nüMaps Lifetime[™]

For a one-time payment, you can receive up to four map updates each year for the life of your unit. For more information, go to www.garmin.com.

About GPS Satellite Signals

Your zūmo must acquire GPS (Global Positioning System) satellite signals in order to navigate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, your zūmo cannot acquire satellites. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions to use your zūmo.

When your $z\bar{u}mo$ has acquired satellite signals, the signal strength bars on the Menu page are green **DOM**. When it loses satellite signals, the bars turn red or clear **DOM**.

Troubleshooting

Problem/Question	Solution/Answer
My zūmo never gets satellite signals.	Take your zūmo out of parking garages and away from tall buildings and trees. Remain stationary for several minutes.
The suction cup will not stay on my windshield.	Clean the suction cup and windshield with rubbing alcohol. Dry with a clean, dry cloth. Mount the suction cup as described on page 3.
My zūmo does not charge in my vehicle.	Check the fuse in the vehicle power cable (see page 42). Ensure that the vehicle is turned on and is supplying power to the power outlet. Your zūmo can only charge between 32°F and 104°F (between 0°C and 40°C). If the zūmo is placed in direct sunlight or in a hot environment, it cannot charge.
My battery does not stay charged for very long.	To maximize the time between charges, turn down the backlight. Touch Tools > Settings > Display > Brightness . To avoid draining the battery, remove the battery when your zūmo is not in use.
My battery gauge does not seem accurate.	Allow the unit to fully discharge, and fully charge it (without interrupting the charge cycle).
How do I clear all my user data?	Hold your finger on the lower-right corner of the zūmo screen while it is turning on. Keep your finger pressed until the message appears. Touch Yes to clear all user data.
The zūmo is locked up/frozen.	If the zūmo stops functioning, turn the zūmo off and on again. If this does not help, press and hold \bigcirc for 10 seconds. The zūmo should operate normally. You can also remove the battery, and then reinstall it.

Problem/Question	Solution/Answer
The touch screen is not responding to my touches properly.	Calibrate the touch screen as described on page 40.
How do I know my zūmo is in USB mass storage mode?	When your zūmo is in USB mass storage mode, a picture of a zūmo connected to a computer is shown. Also, you should see two new removable disk drives listed in My Computer .
My computer never senses that the zūmo is connected.	 Unplug the mini-USB cable from your computer. Turn the zūmo off. Plug the mini-USB cable into a USB port on your computer and into your zūmo. The zūmo automatically turns on and goes into USB mass storage mode. Ensure that your zūmo is connected to a USB port and not a USB hub.
I cannot see any new removable drives in my list of drives.	If you have several network drives mapped on your computer, Windows can have trouble assigning drive letters to your zūmo drives. See your operating system Help file to learn how to map or assign drive letters.
How can I find restaurants near the hotel I will be staying at in the future?	 Touch Where To? > Near > Different City (and enter your vacation destination). Find the hotel, and touch Gol. Touch Menu > Where To? > Near > My Destination. Search for a restaurant. Restaurants nearest your hotel are listed first. You can also use the GPS simulator (Tools > Settings > System).
