Connecting the Device to Vehicle Power

↑ WARNING

This product contains a lithium-ion battery. To prevent the possibility of personal injury or product damage caused by battery exposure to extreme heat, remove the device from the vehicle when exiting or store it out of direct sunlight.

Before you use your device on battery power, you should charge it.

- 1. Fit the bottom of your device into the mount.
- 2. Tilt your device back until it snaps into place.

3. Plug the vehicle power cable into the mini-USB connector ① on the mount ②.



4. Plug the other end of the vehicle power cable into a power outlet in your vehicle.

- The device turns on.
- The device acquires satellite signals. When at least one of the bars is green, your device has acquired satellite signals.

NOTE: The device may need a clear view of the sky to acquire satellite signals.

The device charges as you drive.
 in the status bar indicates the status of the internal battery.

Attaching the Device to the Windshield

NOTICE

Before mounting the device, see the *Important Safety and Product Information* guide for information about laws pertaining to windshield mounting.

- 1. Remove the clear plastic from the suction cup.
- Clean and dry your windshield and the suction cup with a lint-free cloth.
- 3. Press the suction cup to the windshield.
- 4. While pressing, flip the lever back toward the windshield.
- 5. Snap the mount ① onto the suction cup arm ②.



About myDashboard

Use myDashboard to register your device, check for software and map updates, access product manuals and support, and more.

Setting Up myDashboard

- 1. Connect the USB cable to the USB port on the device.
- 2. Connect the USB cable to the USB port on your computer.
- 3. Go to www.garmin.com/dashboard.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Registering the Device

- From myDashboard, click Register Now.
- 2. Follow on-screen instructions.

Updating the Software

- 1. Open myDashboard (page 3).
- 2. Under Software Updates, click **Update Now**.

Device Overview

The device has a Power key ①, a microSD™ ② card slot, and a micro-USB cable port ③.



Turning Off the Device

You can power off the device completely.

- Hold the Power key for 3 seconds.
 NOTE: If you hold the Power key for less than 3 seconds, the device enters sleep mode.
- Select Power Off.

Resetting the Device

You can reset your device if it stops functioning.

Hold the Power key for 10 seconds.

About Sleep Mode

Use sleep mode to conserve battery power when your device is not in use. Sleep mode uses very little power, and a battery charge lasts for weeks when your device is in sleep mode.

Entering Sleep Mode

Press the **Power** key.

Exiting Sleep Mode

While the device is in sleep mode, press the **Power** key and doubletap •

Adjusting the Screen Brightness

Select Tools > Settings > Display > Brightness.

2. Use the slider bar to adjust the brightness.

Adjusting the Volume

- Select Volume.
- 2. Select an option:
 - Use the slider bar to adjust the master volume
 - Select \(\sqrt{\operation} \) to mute the device.
 - Select **III**, and use the slider bars to adjust the volume for navigation prompts, phone, and media.

Status Bar Icons

The status bar is located at the top of the main menu. The status bar icons display information about features on the device. You can select some icons to change settings or view additional information.



Transportation Modes



Routing and navigation are calculated differently based on your transportation mode.

For example, in Automobile mode, the estimated time of arrival is calculated using the speed limit of the roads on the route. Pedestrian mode calculates time of arrival based on walking speed.

NOTE: Pedestrian routes do not include highways. If you have cityXplorer™ maps loaded on your device, pedestrian routes may include public transit (page 30).

Choosing a Transportation Mode Select

Using the On-screen Buttons

- Select to return to the main menu.
- Hold to quickly return to the main menu.
- Select ↑ and ↓ to see more choices.
- Hold ↑ and ↓ to scroll faster.
- Select **t** to see a menu of options for the current screen.

Using the On-screen KeyboardSee "System Settings" to change the keyboard layout (page 62).

- Select a character on the keyboard to enter a letter or number.
- Select ____ to add a space.
- Select ◀ and ▶ to move the cursor.
- Select to delete a character.
- Select and hold to erase the entire entry.
- Select to select the keyboard language mode.
- Select to enter special characters, such as punctuation marks.
- Select to change character capitalization.

Main Menu

About Main Menu Customization



You can create a customized main menu by adding icons from other screens on the device, such as location categories or frequently used tools. You can also edit the size and position of the main menu icons

You can switch between the default main menu and your customized main menu.

Adding an Icon to the Custom Main Menu

The main menu can contain up to 15 icons.

1. Touch Tools > Settings > Main Menu > Customize.



NOTE: The Where To?, View Map, and Tools icons are automatically included on the main menu, and cannot be deleted.

- 2. Touch in the square you would like to fill
- Touch an icon.

The icon is added to the custom main menu.

TIP: Select ▶ to view additional icons in a category.

4. Touch Save.

Editing the Main Menu Icons

Before you can edit icons, you must create a customized main menu (page 8).

- 1. Touch Tools > Settings > Main Menu > Customize.
- 2. Select an icon on the page.

- **NOTE**: The main menu can fit up to two large icons.
- Touch to shrink a large icon.
- Drag an icon across the screen to move the icon.
- 4. Touch **♥** > **Save**.

Choosing a Main Menu

You can switch between the default main menu and your customized main menu. Your customizations are saved while you use the default main menu.

- 2. Select Use Default or Use Customized.

About Points of Interest

The detailed maps loaded in your device contain points of interest, such as restaurants, hotels, and auto services. Use the Points of Interest function to browse for nearby businesses and attractions.

Finding a Point of Interest by Category

- Select Where To? > Points of Interest.
- 2. Select a category.
- 3. If necessary, select a subcategory.
- Select a location.
 The location map appears.
- 5. Select Go!.
- 6. If necessary, select an option:
 - Select Drive.
 - Select Walk.

- Select Public Transit to calculate a route that combines public transit and walking.
 - **NOTE**: You must have cityXplorer[™] maps loaded to navigate using public transit (page 30).
- 7. If necessary, select a route (page 11).

Using Multiple Route Preview NOTE: See page 65 to enable multiple route preview.

The device calculates routes based on one of three criteria: fastest time, shortest distance, and least amount of fuel consumed. You can select which route calculation method you prefer before you begin navigating.

1. From the location map, select **Go!** and, if necessary, select **Drive** (page 10).

- A map appears with faster time, shorter distance, and less fuel routes highlighted.
- 2. Use the on-screen buttons to select a route (page 7).
- 3. Select Go!.

Searching Within a Category

To narrow your search results, you can search within some categories.

- Select Where To? > Points of Interest.
- 2. Select a category.
- 3. If necessary, select a subcategory.
- 4. Select Q.
- 5. Enter all or part of the name.
- 6. Select Done.

Adding a Point to a Route

Before you can add a stop, you must be navigating a route in Automobile mode (page 10).

Finding Locations

- 1 Select Where To?
- 2. Search for the location (page 10).
- 3 Select Go!
- 4. Select Add to Current Route.

Searching Near Another Location

By default, your device finds locations closest to your current location. You can find a location near another city or location.

- 1. Select Where To? > > Near.
- 2. Select an option, and select **Save**.
- 3. If necessary, select a location.

Taking a Detour

While navigating a route, you can use detours to avoid obstacles ahead of you, such as construction zones.

NOTE: If the route you are currently taking is the only reasonable option, the device might not calculate a detour.

- 1. While navigating a route, select to return to the main menu.
- 2. Select **Detour** or **Recalc**.

Finding Parking

This is a nüLink! service (page 44).

You can find detailed parking information, including parking availability in nearby garages, and pricing information.

- 1. Select Where To? > Parking.
- 2. Select an option.
- 3. Select a parking location.

Finding Your Last Parking Spot

When you remove your device from the vehicle mount while the device is on, your current location is saved as a parking spot.


Select Where To? > Parking > Last Spot.

Saving a Parking Spot

- 1. Select Where To? > Parking.
- 2. Select Find Parking or Last Spot.
- 3. Select \blacksquare > Save.
- 4. If necessary, enter a name.

Stopping the Route

While navigating a route, select **3**



Navigating Off Road

If you are not following roadways as you navigate, use Off Road mode.

- 1. Select Tools > Settings > Navigation.
- 2. Select Automobile > nüRoute > Calculation Mode > Off Road > Save

The route will be calculated as a straight line to the location.

Saving a Home Location

You can set your home location for the location you return to most often.

- 1. Select Where To? > == > Set
 Home Location
- 2. Select Enter My Address, Use My Current Location, or Recently Found.

The location is saved as "Home" in Favorites (page 18).

Going Home

Select Where To? > Go Home.

Resetting Your Home Location

- 1. Select Where To? > == > Set
 Home Location
- 2. Select an option.

Editing Your Home Location Information

- Select Where To? > Favorites > Home.
- 2. Select **=** > **Edit**.

Finding Locations

- 3. Enter your changes.
- Select Done.

Location Searches

You can search for locations by using the on-screen keyboard, entering the location's address or coordinates, browsing the map, and more.

Finding a Location by Spelling the Name

This is a nüLink! feature (page 44).

- 1. Select Where To? > Points of Interest > Local Search.
- 2. Enter a business name or a type of business

For example, you can enter "Starbucks" or "Coffee."

3. Select Done.

Search results from nüLink! services appear, if available.

- 4. If necessary, select the **Garmin** tab to search the Garmin map data loaded on your device.
- 5 Select a location

Finding an Address

NOTE: The order of the steps may change depending on the map data loaded on your device.

- 1. Select Where To? > Address.
- 2. If necessary, change the state, the country, or the province.
- 3. Select an option:
 - Select Spell City or Enter Postal Code, enter the city or postal code, and select Done.
 Postal code searching is not available in all areas.
 - Select Search All to search all cities in the state or province.
- 4. Enter the address number, and select **Done**.

- 5. Enter the street name, and select **Done**
- 6. If necessary, select the street.
- 7. If necessary, select the address.

Browsing the Map

- Select Where To? > Browse Map.
- See "Using the Location Map" (page 16) for information on using map buttons.

Finding a Location by Browsing the Map

- 1. Select Where To? > Browse Map.
- 2 Drag and zoom the map to display the area to search.

Location markers appear on the map for places along the road.

- 3. Select an option:
 - Select a location marker.
 - Select a point, such as a street, intersection, or address location.

- An information balloon appears for the location
- 4. If necessary, select the location description to view additional information

Viewing a List of Recently Found Locations

Your device stores the last 50 locations you have found.

Select Where To? > Recently Found

Clearing the List of Recently Found Places

Select Where To? > Recently Found > = > Clear > Yes.

Finding a Location Using Coordinates

You can find a location using latitude and longitude coordinates. This can be helpful when geocaching.

1 Select Where To? > Coordinates

Finding Locations

- If necessary, select > Format, select the correct coordinate format for the type of map you are using, and select Save.
- 3. Select the latitude coordinate.
- 4. Enter the new coordinate, and select **Done**.
- 5. Select the longitude coordinate.
- 6. Enter the new coordinate, and select **Done**.
- 7. Select View on Map.

Using the Location Map

The location map appears after you select a location from the Where To? menu.



- Touch ① to save the location to your Favorites.
- On some models, touch ① to call the selected location when the device is connected to a phone.
- Touch the information balloon ②
 to view more information for the
 location.
- Touch 3 to zoom in and out.
- Touch

 to return to the previous page.
- Touch (5) to view different parts of the map.
- Touch **6** to create a turn-by-turn route to this location.

Previewing a Route on the Map

- 1. From the location map, select the information balloon.
- 2. Select the route information box.

Rating a Point of Interest

When available, you can view and change the star rating for a point of interest.

- 1. From the location map, select the information balloon.
- 2. Select the stars to rate the point of interest.

The star rating updates on your device.

Editing a Phone Number for a Point of Interest

- 1. From the location map, select the information balloon.
- 2. Select => Edit Phone Number.
- 3. Enter the correct phone number, and select **Done**.

Reporting an Incorrect Point of Interest

This is a nüLink! service (page 44).

If your search results contain an outdated or incorrect point of interest,

you can report the error to Garmin and remove the location from future searches.

- 1. From the location map, select the information balloon.
- 2. Select **=** > **Report Error** > **Yes**.

This information is sent to Garmin when your device is receiving a nüLink! signal or when you connect your device to myGarmin using your computer.

Setting a Simulated Location

If you are indoors or not receiving satellite signals, you can use the GPS simulator to set a simulated location.

- 1. Select Tools > Settings > System.
- 2. Select GPS Simulator > On > Save.
- From the main menu, select Where To? > Browse Map.
- 4. Select an area on the map.

Finding Locations

An information balloon appears for the location.

5. Select => Set Location.

Favorites

You can save locations in your Favorites so you can quickly find them and create routes to them. Your home location is also stored in Favorites.

Saving Your Location to Favorites

- 1. From the map, select the vehicle icon.
- Select Save.
- 3. Enter a name, and select **Done**.
- 4. Select OK.

The location is saved in Favorites.

Saving Locations to Favorites

- 1. Search for the location (page 10).
- From the location map, select
 > Save > OK.

Finding Favorites

- Select Where To? > Favorites.
- 2. If necessary, select a category.
- 3. Select a saved location.

Editing Favorites

- 1. Select Where To? > Favorites.
- 2. If necessary, select a category.
- 3. Select a Favorite.
- 4. Select \blacksquare > Edit.
- 5. Select an option:
 - Select Name
 - Select Phone Number.
 - To assign categories to the Favorite, select Categories.
 - To save a photo with the Favorite, select Assign Photo (page 41).
 - To change the symbol used to mark the Favorite on a map, select Change Map Symbol.
- 6. Edit the information.
- Select Done.

Adding a Category

You can add custom categories to organize your favorites.

NOTE: Categories appear in the Favorites menu after you have saved more than 12 Favorites.

- 1. Select Where To? > Favorites.
- 2. Select the Favorite.
- 3. Select => Edit > Categories.
- 4. Select **★**.
- Enter the category name, and select **Done**.

Deleting Favorites

NOTE: Deleted Favorites cannot be recovered.

- 1. Select Where To? > Favorites.
- 2. If necessary, select a category.
- 3. Select the Favorite.
- 4. Select \blacksquare > Delete > Yes.

Planning a Trip

You can use the trip planner to create and save a trip with multiple destinations.

- 1. Select Where To? > Trip Planner.
- 2. Select +
- 3. Select Select Start Location.
- 4. Search for a location (page 10).
- 5. Select Select.
- 6. To add additional locations, select

 ★.
- 7. Select Next.
- 8. Enter a name, and select **Done**.

Editing a Trip Itinerary

- 1. Select Where To? > Trip Planner.
- 2. Select a saved trip.



- 3. Select an option:
 - Select ① to change the arrival or departure time.
 - Select ① > Duration to record how long you will stay at a location.
 - Select ② to change the transportation mode or route preference for that portion of the trip.
 - Select Map to view the trip on the map.

Navigating to a Saved Trip

- 1. Select Where To? > Trip Planner.
- 2. Select a saved trip.
- 3. Select Go!.
- 4. If prompted, select a route (page 11).

Editing a Saved Trip

- 1. Select Where To? > Trip Planner.
- 2. Select a saved trip.
- 3. Select **=**.
- 4. Select an option:
 - Select Rename Trip.
 - Select Edit Destinations to add and delete locations, or to change the order of locations.
 - Select Delete Trip.
 - Select Optimize Order to arrange the stops on your trip in the most-efficient order.

Voice Command

NOTE: Voice Command is not available for all languages and regions.

The Voice Command feature allows you to use your device by saying words and commands. The Voice Command menu provides voice prompts and a list of available commands.

Setting your Wakeup Phrase

The wakeup phrase is a word or phrase you can say to activate Voice Command. The default wakeup phrase is **Voice Command**.

TIP: You can reduce the chance of accidental Voice Command activation by using a strong wakeup phrase.

- Select Tools > Voice Command > Customize Phrase.
- Enter a new wakeup phrase.The device indicates the strength of the wakeup phrase as you enter the phrase.
- 3. Select Done.

Activating Voice Command

Say your wakeup phrase.

The Voice Command menu appears.

Voice Command Tips

- Speak in a normal voice directed at the device.
- Reduce background noise, such as voices or the radio, to increase the accuracy of the voice recognition.
- Speak commands as they appear on the screen.
- Respond to voice prompts from the device as needed.
- Increase the length of your wakeup phrase to reduce the chance of accidental Voice Command activation.
- Listen for two tones to confirm when the device enters and exits Voice Command mode.

Speak commands when appears in the upper-right corner of the screen.

Starting a Route Using Voice Command

You can say the names of popular, well-known locations.

- 1. Say your wakeup phrase.
- 2. Say Find by Name.
- 3. Listen for the voice prompt, and speak the name of the location.



A list of locations appears.

4. Say the line number.



5. Say Navigate.



Finding an Address

- 1. Say Voice Command.
- 2. Say Find Address.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Muting Instructions

You can disable the voice prompts for Voice Command without muting the device.

- 1. Select Tools > Voice Command >
- 2. Select Mute Instructions > Enabled

Disabling Voice Command

You can disable voice command, which prevents you from accidentally opening the voice command while speaking.

- 1. Select Tools > Voice Command >
- Select Voice Command > Disabled.

Map Pages

Following an Automobile Route

The route is marked with a magenta line. A checkered flag marks your destination

As you travel, the device guides you to the destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the map. If you depart from the original route, the device recalculates the route and provides new directions.



Changing the Map Data Field

- 1. From the map, touch the data field in the lower left-hand corner.
- 2. Select a type of data to display.
- 3. Touch Save.

Updating Speed Limits

NOTICE

The speed limit icon feature is for information only and does not replace the driver's responsibility to abide by all posted speed limit signs and to use safe driving judgment at all times. Garmin will not be responsible for any traffic fines or citations that you may receive for failing to follow all applicable traffic laws and signs.

An icon displaying the current speed limit may appear as you travel on major roadways.

1. From the map, select > Set Speed Limit.

Map Pages

2. Select and to set the speed limit.

Using myTrends

The myTrends[™] feature predicts when you are driving to locations to which you frequently travel and displays the location, estimated time of travel, and traffic information in the navigation bar on the map.

- Select Tools > Settings > Navigation.
- Select Automobile > nüRoute > myTrends > Enabled.
- 3. Save a location, like your home or workplace, as a Favorite (page 18).
- 4. When myTrends information appears in the navigation bar, select it to view route information.

Viewing Trip Information

The trip information page displays your present speed and provides statistics about your trip.

TIP: If you make frequent stops, leave the device turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

From the map, select the **Speed** field.



Resetting Trip Information

- From the map, select the **Speed** field.
- 2. Select =
- 3. Select an option:
 - When not navigating a route, select Reset All to reset every data field, except the speedometer, on the page.
 - Select Reset Trip Data to reset the information on the trip computer.
 - Select Reset Max. Speed to reset the maximum speed.
 - Select Reset Trip B to reset the odometer.

Viewing a List of Turns

While navigating an automobile route, you can view all of the turns and maneuvers for your entire route and the distance between turns

1. Select the text bar on the top of the map.



2. Select a turn.

The details for the turn appear. If available, an image of the junction appears for junction on major roadways.

Viewing the Entire Route on the Map

- 1. While navigating an automobile route, select the navigation bar at the top of the map.
- 2. Select **=** > **Map**.

Viewing the Next Turn

While navigating an automobile route, a preview of the next turn, lane change, or other maneuver appears in the upper-left corner of the map. The preview includes the distance to the turn or maneuver and the lane in which you should be traveling, if available.

From the map, select to view the next turn on the map.



Viewing the Junction View

While navigating an automobile route, you can view the junctions on major roadways. When you approach a junction in a route, the image of that junction appears briefly, if available.

From the map, select to view the junction, if available.



Using the Pedestrian Navigation Map

In Pedestrian mode, your route is displayed on a two-dimensional map.



- Select ① to switch between sections of the route.
- Select ② to view the route itinerary.
- Select 3 to center the map on your current location
- Select 4 to zoom in and zoom out.

About the Pedestrian Position Icon

While navigating in Pedestrian mode, the position icon indicates your approximate position and your direction of travel on the map.

The circle around the position icon indicates the accuracy of your position on the map. A smaller circle means the displayed position is more accurate.

Public Transit Options

If you have cityXplorer maps installed, the device calculates a route that uses a combination of public transit options, such as riding a bus or subway, and walking.

NOTE: cityXplorer maps are not included with the device. See http://my.garmin.com to purchase cityXplorer maps.

The yellow icons indicate the navigation method used in each section of the route. For example, when you see , board a bus at that point in the route.

The black dots on the map are public transit stops along your route.

NOTE: You can change the types of public transit and limit the distance spent walking during a pedestrian route (page 63).

Hands-Free Phone Calls

Using Bluetooth® wireless technology, your device can connect to your mobile phone to become a hands-free device. To determine whether your mobile phone with Bluetooth technology is compatible with your device, go to www.garmin.com/bluetooth.

Your phone may not support all of the hands-free phone features your device provides.

Enabling Bluetooth Wireless Technology

- Select Tools > Settings > Bluetooth
- 2. Select Bluetooth > Enabled > Save

Pairing Your Phone

Before you can use hands-free calling, you must pair your device with a compatible mobile phone. Pairing your phone with your device allows your phone and device to recognize each other and connect quickly.

- 1. Place your phone and your device within 30 ft. (10 m) of each other.
- 2. On your device, enable Bluetooth wireless technology (page 31).
- 3. Select an option:
 - Select Add Phone.
 - If you have already paired a different phone, select Phone
 +
- 4. On your phone, enable Bluetooth wireless technology.
- On your device, select **OK**.
 A list of nearby Bluetooth devices appears.

- 6. Select your phone from the list, and select **OK**
- If necessary, on your phone, confirm that the device is allowed to connect.
- If necessary, enter the device Bluetooth PIN (1234) into your phone.

Tips after Pairing the Devices

- After the initial pairing, the two devices can connect automatically each time you turn them on.
- When your phone is connected to your device, you are ready to make phone calls.
- When you turn on the device, it tries to connect to the last phone to which it was connected.
- You might need to set your mobile phone to connect to the device automatically when it is turned on.

Receiving a Call

When you receive a call, select an option:

- Select Answer.
- Select **Ignore** to ignore the call.

Using In-Call Options

- 1. While on a call, select .
- 2. Select an option:
 - To transfer audio to your phone, select **Handset**.
 - **TIP**: You can use this feature if you want to turn off your device and remain on the call, or if you need privacy.
 - To transfer the audio from your phone to your device, select Hands-free.
 - To display a keypad, select Keypad.

TIP: You can use this feature to use automated systems, such as voice mail.

- To mute the microphone, select **Mute**.
- To hang up, select End Call.

Using the Phone Book

Your phone book is loaded from your phone to the device each time your phone and the device connect. It may take a few minutes for the phone book to be available. Some phones do not support this feature.

- Faster Time—calculates routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance.

- Less Fuel—calculates routes that could use less fuel than other routes
- Prompted—prompts you to select a route calculation mode before navigating (pages 11).
- Off Road—calculates a direct line from your location to your destination

trafficTrends

When the traffic Trends[™] feature is enabled, your device records historic traffic data and uses that data to calculate more-efficient routes. This information is sent to Garmin when your device is receiving a nüLink![™] signal or when you connect your device to myGarmin[™] using your computer.

NOTE: Different routes may be calculated based on traffic trends for the day of the week or the time of day.

Caring for Your Device

NOTICE

Avoid dropping your device and operating it in high-shock and high-vibration environments.

Do not expose the device to water.

Contact with water can cause this device to malfunction.

Do not store the device where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur, because it can cause permanent damage.

Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touchscreen, or damage may result.

Cleaning the Outer Casing

NOTICE

Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

- Clean the outer casing of the device (not the touchscreen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution.
- 2. Wipe the device dry.

Cleaning the Touchscreen

Changing the Fuse in the Vehicle Power Cable

NOTICE

When replacing the fuse, do not lose any of the small pieces and make sure they are put back in the proper position. The vehicle power cable does not work unless it is assembled correctly.

If your device does not charge in your vehicle, you may need to replace the fuse located at the tip of the vehicle adapter.

- 2. Remove the backing from the adhesive on the bottom of the disk.
- 3. Place the disk on the dashboard.

- 5. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk.
- 6. Flip the lever down (toward the disk).

Troubleshooting

Problem	Solution
My device is not acquiring satellite signals.	 Verify the GPS simulator is turned off (page 62). Select Tools > Settings > System > GPS Simulator > Off. Take your device out of parking garages and away from tall buildings and trees. Remain stationary for several minutes.
The suction cup will not stay on my windshield.	 Clean the suction cup and windshield with rubbing alcohol. Dry with a clean, dry cloth. Mount the suction cup (page 3).
The device does not charge in my vehicle.	 Check the fuse in the vehicle power cable (page 71). Verify the vehicle is turned on and is supplying power to the power outlet. Your device can only charge between 32°F and 113°F (between 0°C and 45°C). If the device is placed in direct sunlight or in a hot environment, it cannot charge.
My battery does not stay charged for very long.	To maximize the time between changes, turn down the backlight (page 66).

My battery gauge does not seem accurate.	Allow the unit to fully discharge, and fully charge it (without interrupting the charge cycle).
How do I know my device is in USB mass storage mode?	When your device is in USB mass storage mode, a picture of a device connected to a computer is shown on the device screen. Also, you should see two new removable disk drives listed in My Computer .
The device is connected to the computer, but it will not go into mass storage mode.	 Disconnect the USB cable from your computer. Turn off the device. Plug the USB cable into a USB port on your computer and into your device. The device automatically turns on and goes into USB mass storage mode. Verify your device is connected to a USB port and not a USB hub.
I cannot see any new removable drives in my list of drives.	If you have several network drives mapped on your computer, Windows can have trouble assigning drive letters to your device drives. Refer to your operating system Help file to learn how to map or assign drive letters.
My phone will not connect to the device.	 Select Tools > Settings > Bluetooth. The Bluetooth field must be set to Enabled. Turn on your phone and bring it within 33 feet of the device. Go to www.garmin.com/bluetooth for more help.

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
